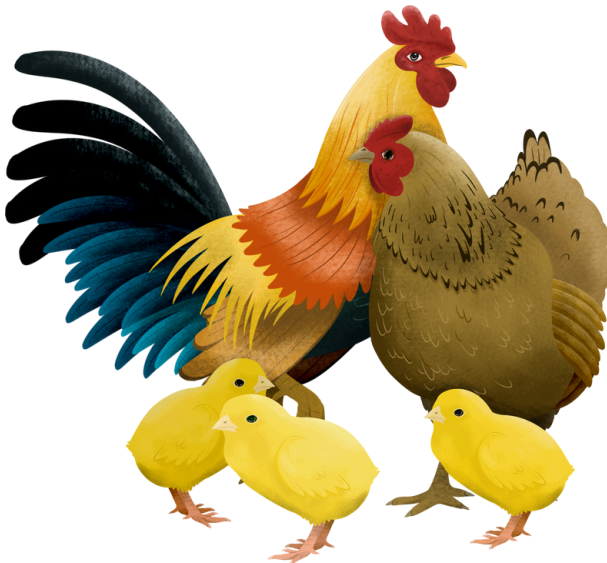

## Review of HOUSE OF DOORS

A lively group met at my home to discuss Malaysian writer Tan Twan's historical novel, "House of Doors". It was inspired by Somerset Maugham's story "The Letter", which describes the murder by Ethel Proudlock of her lover in 1911.

This story is about love, affairs, regrets, homosexuality, inequality, politics and murder, based on both fact and fiction. We were fortunate to have Rosemary who spent years in Africa to translate the African words, and Jan had been to Penang in Malaysia and knew the area.

There was good critique. Some readers enjoyed the book for the beauty of prose, use of African words, description of the beauty in natural setting, the culture and an appeal to the senses. Others felt it was hard to separate fact from fiction, and hard to understand why certain parts were included which interrupted the flow of the story and why it wasn't good enough to be a Booker prize nomination. I felt the meaning of the title alluded to new opportunity or changes when one door or life chapter closes to a new one opening.
