

**Where:** The Raptors is located at 1877 Herd Road in Duncan. Due to road works the best approach if coming from the south, is to turn right onto Trunk Road, left onto Lakes Road and then continue all the way to Herd Road. Turn right and look for The Raptors on your left just after Richards Trail.

#### **Review of BURIAL RITES**

This month we discussed Burial Rites by Hanna Kent, which tells the true story of Agnes Magnusdottir who has been charged with the brutal murder of 2 men. She has been removed to her homeland's farthest reaches in northern Iceland, to await her execution. The time period is the nineteenth century and Agnes was the last woman to be executed in Iceland.

Initially she is shunned by the family who are charged with looking after her, but gradually her story comes out and they have some understanding of her life and trials. A local assistant priest helps her to tell her tale. The wife of the family sees that she is a hard worker and has been poorly treated by a man leading to the murder.

The group felt that this was a very sad story and there was much sympathy for Agnes. We also all felt that life in Iceland at that time was very difficult to say the least. The story was well conveyed by the author. She really had a good feel for the land and the people.

## MEETING TIME: 2ND TUESDAY MONTHLY AT 10 AM

The Better Bookies selection for September is The House of Doors written by Tan Twan Eng. It is mainly set in colonial Penang in the early twentieth century and is partly based on real events.

The story's main two characters are Lesley Hamlyn, an English woman and the wife of Robert (a lawyer), along with Somerset Maugham, a famed writer and an old friend of Robert's. Another historical figure, Dr. Sun Yat Sen plays a minor role. This book is told from the point of view of both Lesley and Maugham and is set in both the past and the present. It looks at the colonial era in this part of Asia and we learn about Lesley's life, her ambitions and her willingness risk her reputation by becoming involved with some of the Asians who live in Penang. Somerset is looking for inspiration for a new book and Lesley 's recounting of her experiences stimulates him to write another book of short stories.

Tan Twan Eng explores love, betrayal, relationships and the social inequalities rising from British colonialism. His book is highlighted by his gorgeous writing.
